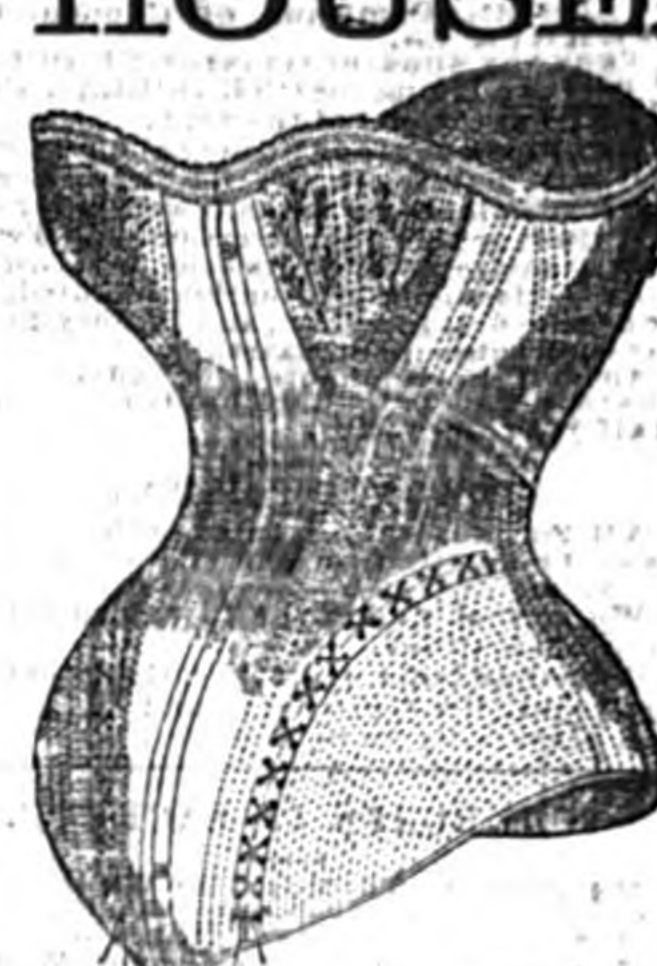


MONTREAL HOUSE
