The entire service was a most impressive one, and must have greatly profited the large congregation that crowded the Church.

LOCAL COUNCIL MEETING.

The Municipal Council of Lachute held its monthly sitting on Monday last, at the Court House. Present the following councillors: Patrick Dunbar, Mayor; Messrs. Dunderberg, Hope, Smith, Shepherd, McQuat and Desjardins.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved. The matter of the keeping in repair of the East Settlement Road was taken up for discussion. It seemed a vexatious question who was responsible for doing this. The Town Inspector did not seem to know who was to perform the work, and the Council did not seem able to inform him. It seems there is no *provisio carere*, which appears to be the cause of the trouble. The matter was not settled, and is to be brought up at a future meeting for discussion.

The matter of the Voters' list was then taken up. The list was read over by the Secretary, and the following resolution put and carried: Moved by Coun. Smith, seconded by Coun. Shepherd, that the said list be accepted and passed.

The annual Financial Statement was then read over. A number of defaulting ratepayers' taxes were struck off. The amounts were only struck off because they could not be recovered by law, being overdue. The motion was moved by Coun. McQuat, seconded by Coun. Smith, Coun. McQuat moved, seconded by Coun. Shepherd, that the annual Financial Statement be accepted, and that it be referred to the auditors, for their examination. Carried. Mr. Phipps Lane and Mr. Root, Meikle were appointed auditors.

The Council soon after adjourned.

COUNTY COUNCIL.

The first meeting of the County Council for the year 1881, met in the Court House, Lachute, on Wednesday, the 9th day of March, 1881.

MAYORS PRESENT.

John Hay, Alex. Prichard, James B. Brown, John Dunbar, Patrick Dunbar, Geo. Simpson, Matthew Strong, John Chambers, Francis Asselin, Michel Campane, David Stanforth, Isaac Jekill.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Dunbar, and resolved, that Mayor Hay take the chair until the election of a Warden.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Dunbar, that Mayor Hay be Warden.

Moved in amendment by Mayor Simpson, seconded by Mayor Campane, that Mayor Prichard be Warden of this Council.

The amendment being put to the meeting. Yes, Mayors Simpson, Jekill, Strong, Chambers, Asselin, Campane, Hope, Mayor Brown, Dunbar and Dunbar. The original motion being put, it was lost on the same division.

The oath of office was then taken by Mayor Prichard, as Warden, and filed in the office.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Strong, that the minutes of last meeting stand approved.

The Secretary read the letter of advice from Mr. McKay, Advocate, on the Calder land question.

Moved by Mayor Strong, seconded by Mayor Brown, that Mr. McKay's letter of advice be received and filed, and that the matter be left over until next session for further consideration.

Moved by Mayor Simpson seconded by Mayor Hay, that the Petition of the Fishery Protection Association of this County of Argenteuil, to the Minister of Marine and Fisheries of the Dominion of Canada, presented to this Council, be adopted and signed by the Warden, on behalf of said Council, and forwarded to the Hon. Mr. Pope, Minister of Marine and Fisheries.

The question of the valuation rolls to be made in the County of Argenteuil, in reference to valuations of the properties in the County, was discussed at some length.

Moved by Mayor Hay, seconded by Mayor Jekill, that the attention of Local Councils be called to Article No. 718, of the Municipal Code of the Province of Quebec, and that the Secretary notify each Council of this resolution.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Hay, that the Secretary be instructed to call the attention of the Quebec Legislature to the incongruity of Chap. 36 of 33 Victoria, of the English Statutes, of Province of Quebec, regarding bush-fires and requesting that the said act be so amended as to give power to the County Council to regulate the time for setting such fires.

Moved by Mayor Jekill, seconded by Mayor Hay, that the use of the Court House be allowed to all religious bodies free of charge, provided the motion does not clash with any previous motion.

The process verbal of John Rogers binding certain parties to make the road leading from Cote St. Angelequin to the 5th range of Gore, being read, a contrary petition was read against the passing of the process verbal, said petition being presented by John Riddle and other ratepayers.

Moved by Mayor Strong, seconded by Mayor Brown, that the process verbal of John Rogers be adopted. Carried.

Moved in amendment by Mayor Chambers, seconded by Mayor Stanforth, that the report and process verbal of John Rogers as read be not received and adopted by this Council. Lost.

Moved by Mayor Strong, seconded by Mayor Chambers, that Messrs. Owens and Lane be the auditors for the ensuing year.

Mayor Brown stated that Mr. Thos. Barron, late Warden, would pay the amount he has in his hands belonging to the County, on or about the 1st of May next.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Strong, that Couns. Simpson and Chambers be appointed delegates for this Council.

The Secretary laid before the Council the Financial Statement for the past year.

Moved by Mayor Hay, seconded by Mayor Strong, that the accounts just read be received and handed to the auditors for audit.

Moved by Mayor Strong, seconded by Mayor Simpson, that the Sec. Treas. be authorized to collect from the late Warden the monies in his hands belonging to this Council, amounting to \$532, with interest from the 11th Nov., 1878.

Moved by Mayor Brown, seconded by Mayor Chambers, that the Valuation Roll for the township of Wolfe be received.

The Council then adjourned.

Decisions Regarding Newspapers.

1. Any person who takes a newspaper regularly from the post-office, whether it be published through the subscription or otherwise, is not responsible for its contents.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

3. In suits for subscriptions, the suit may be instituted in the place where the paper is published, though the subscriber may reside hundreds of miles away.

4. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the post-office, or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

THE EMPIRE OF THE ASSASSINATED Czar.

In the past hundred years, two nations have grown from comparative insignificance, to the first rank among the principalities of the earth; they are located on opposite hemispheres; they are hostile in principles, and they are engaged in antagonistic theories of political power. In each is the desire of existence absolute, running through all the departments of Government, influencing society, and controlling the administration of affairs. These two nations are the United States of America, and the Empire of Russia; the one represents the spirit of liberty, the other that of despotism. These are the antagonizing principles which have been struggling for the mastery of mankind. They are approaching each other every hour, with marshalled forces completely armed for the final onslaught, when it shall be decided which is to dominate in the future. The advance of these two powers has been rapid, and illustrates the principles which have controlled their policy. The United States, with the finest position, geographically, on the globe, with a vast territory lying mostly in the temperate zone, and being a whole continent, has progressed with great rapidity. Her policy has dictated the acquisition of the large grazing and agricultural domain of the former republic of Texas, the state of California, and the purchase from Russia of Alaska. True, her peaceful progress has been interrupted by the war of 1846, the Mexican campaign, which resulted in the possession of the rich gold fields of that Pacific, her Indian wars, and the late civil struggle. But she is more than compensated for the blood and treasure expended in that unfortunate contest by the abolition of slavery and in the demonstration of the strength of her government, to maintain the union of the States. She now stands among the foremost nations of the world, the possessor of a large territory, in every portion of which the soil is blackened, and with a population of more than fifty millions of frugal and industrious inhabitants; while Russia has attained greatness by the spirit of war, and the fruit of intrigue. For centuries the Muscovite was barred from civilized Europe by Poland, and was excluded from the Baltic and the Buxina by the Swedes and the Turks, till the triumph of Pultowa extended the way of Peter the Great to the Bosphorus. Peter not only made Russia a European power, but he pointed her conquests in the direction of the East. He seized Azof, and overran the Crimea, but was compelled to abandon them. The Empress Anne followed his example, and met with the same fate. She was only able to confirm her power over one or two tribes of Cossacks. Catherine renewed the contest, but only could hold Azof, and secured access to the Buxina, but she declared the territory she was unable to retain, independent of Turkey. Step by step Russia extended her power. She obtained the sovereignty of Kabani, and the unlimited right to navigate all a Turkish seas. At the peace of Bucharest in 1812, she secured the provinces of Bessarabia, and the mouth and line of the Pruth. The treaty of Adrianople, transferred to Russia the delta and mouth of the Danube. Thus did Russia press down from her boundaries, as they existed in the time of Peter the Great, into the Turkish territory five hundred miles, surrounded three-fourths of the Buxina sea, crossed to the Caspian sea, and penetrated deeply into Armenia and Persia. Her successful career of conquest had made her arrogant and overbearing, but in the Crimean War, in which she measured her strength against England, France, Turkey, and Sardinia, she met with a disastrous defeat, which humbled her pride, broke her power, and checked her progress. So deeply did the Emperor Nicholas take this humiliation that he died with grief. The credit of the country was destroyed, and the finances exhausted. The prestige which Russia gained in the late war with Turkey, and the advantages she supposed she had secured in the treaty of St. Stefano, were annulled or circumvented by the European Congress which followed. The success which accompanied the arms of Russia in her eastern conquests, had awakened the jealousy of England, as well as some of the continental powers, so that the majority of the representatives in that Congress were easily brought to recognize the political necessity of checking the further advance of this great northern power. Alexander the Second came after his coronation to the throne, gave his serious attention to the internal affairs of the Empire. He emancipated the serfs in 1861, gave independence to Bulgaria, instituted trial by jury, granted freedom to the press, and established local

Parliaments, but the Divine Right of the Czar not only to rule, but to comprise all the powers of the government in his own person remained unchanged. The real government of the Empire still resided in a private Chancery or Bureau, of which the Czar was the head, independent of, and separate from the Ministers of State. His officials were scattered over the whole Empire, and in the name of the Emperor had power to arrest any person, at any time, hold him for trial or transport him without trial to a fortress, or to Siberia. No one had any right to interfere, or enquire into their acts except the Emperor, consequently the Emperor was held responsible for the many acts of tyranny and oppression committed by these officials, who were often prompted by personal feelings of revenge or a corrupt desire for gain. While this principle of absolutism remained, the reforms accorded by Alexander were not satisfactory to his subjects. When the press began to exercise its freedom, to criticize the acts of the government, and censure the attitude of the governing classes, its discussions were called treasonable, and the censorship of the press was restored. Domestic and foreign literature was stamped with its condemnation. The trial by jury soon became a farce, the highways became dilapidated, the charitable institutions of the country, were conducted in a careless manner, and the manumitted serfs found freedom as irksome as servitude, while by their emancipation the estates of the nobles had been broken up, and much lessened in value. This reaction naturally produced a gloomy discontent among all classes. It is reasonable that the non-success of the reforms was attributed to the absolute power of the government, which still resided in the person of the Czar. To strike down this great obstacle, which was believed to stand in the way of the advancement of the people, the fulfilments of assassination were from time to time called into requisition, and several attempts on the life of the Czar were made between 1868 and the 13th of March 1881, when his death was accomplished. Although the Czar had in 1880 abolished the hated Bureau, and placed all police power in the hands of the Minister of the Interior, had named General Mordukhai Chief of the Supreme Council, with almost unlimited powers, and was at the very moment of his death considering the project of establishing a Parliament for the Empire, the malcontents were not satisfied. The nihilists had largely increased in numbers, and were fanatically imbued with the philosophy of Hegel and Michael Bakunin, comprised in the belief that everything must be destroyed in order to build up anew, and that nothing but annihilation can work the salvation of a state. While we stamp with the utmost condemnation the assassination of the late Czar, we can safely say that the nihilists were not prompted to his murder by personal hate, but acted from a blind zeal, in what they believed a righteous cause. The first attempt on the life of Alexander the Second, was made at the gate of the Summer Palace, in April 1868, where a light has ever since burned before an image of the Virgin, erected to commemorate his escape from death. Another attempt was made in Paris, by firing at him while in a carriage with Napoleon the Third, another, in an effort to explode a mine on a railway when the Imperial car should pass over it, still another in an attempt to blow up the dining hall in the Winter Palace. From all these he had by the hand of Providence escaped until on Sunday the 13th of March inst., while on his way from his brother's palace, his body was so shattered and mutilated by a dynamite bomb, that he died two hours afterwards. His assassination sent a shock throughout all the lands, brought overwhelming sorrow to the Imperial Family, and struck with a paralytic fear, the crowned heads throughout the world. The means resorted to, to accomplish the death of Alexander, have ever received the execration of mankind, however despicable the character of the victim, and though the late Czar cannot be held up to the world as a model sovereign, there can be no question but that he possessed many kindly qualities, and was more enlightened and liberal than any of his predecessors. Whether his death is to retard or advance the interests of the Empire, depends upon the manner in which the new Czar shall administer the great trusts which have suddenly been committed to him. He can make Russia a great, powerful, and enlightened nation, by granting his subjects the privileges demanded by the spirit of the age, by abandoning the thirst for conquest, which has been the ruling passion of the Romanoff dynasty, and by a frank and honest policy of peace towards neighboring nations, or by a tyrannical, personal, and oppressive system of government, he can relegate Russia to her former condition of darkness and misery.

THE BONUS MEETING.

A public meeting was held in the Court House on Friday evening last, called by the Mayor for the purpose of hearing the opinion of the ratepayers on the subject of the action of the Municipal Council, in relation to the \$25,000 bonus. The Secretary read the by-law in question, for the purpose of hearing an expression of opinion in the matter. Mr. R. G. Meikle took the floor first, and quoted a few extracts from the WATCHMAN on the subject. He could not, of course, say that had been done by the petitioners in the matter, and all that had been said on the subject in the WATCHMAN, had been done for private purposes; to make political capital, &c. He said the meeting

had been called to learn whether the ratepayers were satisfied with the action of the Council in employing Mr. Wilson to prevent, so far as possible, the accumulation of costs against the ratepayers, through the action of the petitioners against the bonus by-law. Invitations to other speakers being given, Mr. Ireland came forward. He said that by what Mr. Meikle had said, and he believed there were others who were of the same opinion as Mr. Meikle, there appeared to be a huge mistake or misunderstanding in this matter. Referring to the accusation of Mr. Meikle of the action of the petitioners being for party purposes, he said there was not the least foundation for such a charge. The petitioners had acted wholly and solely in the interests and for the benefit of the ratepayers, and entirely independent of politics. The Grits as well as the Conservatives would benefit by their action, so he could not see where the party politics came in. The action of the petitioners was in no way detrimental to the Council, or, rather, it would not have been had they done their duty, viz., looked after the true interests of the ratepayers by opposing the by-law. The Council omitted their duty, so therefore it became necessary for private ratepayers, the petitioners, to do it for them. He said the Council say they are opposing the petitioners because they fear they will be called upon to pay the costs. He would desire them from this fear if they would desist from all action in the matter, provided they paid all the costs they were the cause of. The petitioners were perfectly willing to pay the costs of their case, and if the Council would do as he advised there would be an end to all trouble in the matter. He then put the following motion to the meeting, which was seconded by Mr. James Smith: "That in the opinion of this meeting Mr. Meikle and others, in taking the action they did in trying to get the parish, free from the bonus, have acted in the interest of the ratepayers, and we ask the Council of the parish to support them in this measure."

Mr. Meikle moved in amendment that Mr. Meikle, lawyer, of Montreal, be allowed to express his opinion before the motion be voted upon. Mr. McLaren was received with loud applause, the majority seeming to expect something decisive from him. A question was put to the Chairman as to whether Mr. McLaren was paid for appearing, and if so, was it by order of the Council. The question was not answered at the time, owing to the noise prevailing, but it became afterwards known that he was employed professionally.

Mr. McLaren said he thought he could see a good opportunity of acting as peace-maker. He would try and remove this "bone of contention." He said, "Mr. Ireland has promised to pay the costs of the petition if the Council will pay theirs and abstain from further action in the matter." This would do. He would write Mr. Ireland's proposition on paper, get the petitioners' lawyer to sign it, and that would end the matter, and that amicably. Mr. McLaren having rendered Mr. Ireland's proposition in "legal phraseology," he read it, at the same time calling upon Mr. Ireland to allow Mr. Bampton, his lawyer, to sign it. Mr. Ireland objected, on the very important ground that Mr. McLaren's "document" was erroneous, and as not really representing what he had proposed.

Mr. Bampton then stepped forward and gave a full history of the bonus; from the time of the commencement of the railway to the present proceedings. It will be quite unnecessary to give it here, as all our readers are fully acquainted with all the details.

The Chairman was then requested to put Mr. Ireland's motion to the meeting, and was about to do so, when the following amendment by Mr. R. G. Meikle was put: "That inasmuch as the petitioners, Jaa. Fish and others, have prayed the Court to have the costs settled, or put upon the parish, in connection with the notice, suit and writ of injunction served upon the Council of this parish, that this meeting do approve of the action taken by the Council for to prevent the parish having to pay any such costs, or for any other purpose."

This motion was seconded by Mr. Andrew Walker, and was adopted.

The votes had to be taken in rather a novel manner. Those voting in favor of the amendment going to the right-hand side of the building, those against it, to the left. Those not voting remained in the centre. The count was: in favor 27; against 8. The original motion was accordingly lost. The meeting then closed.

The enumeration is to begin on the 4th of April, and all the statistics will be taken as they stood at that date.

The census is taken for the purpose of ascertaining as exactly as possible the population and resources of the country, and thereby furnishing a correct idea of its strength and capability.

A census is not taken for the purpose of taxation, as, unfortunately, many persons imagine, none of the information contained in it could be used for such purposes. The results it exhibits, like those of any other statistical enquiries are directly connected with the science of government; which presupposes a general knowledge of the wants and capabilities, the defects and advantages, numerically represented, of the population and the country.

It follows that it is the duty of every person in the Dominion, as well as his interest, to assist in obtaining a true and honest statement of facts as they are.

Many persons imagine that the census schedules may be in some way used as a sort of advertisement for them, or as a reflection upon them. The fact is, that these schedules are never seen except by the persons engaged in taking and compiling them, who are sworn officers, bound not to divulge any individual information, care very little for, and have no interest in the individual statements contained in them.

The success of a census, depends upon obtaining an honest return, which shall be as correct as possible.

To this end are required:—1st. A good system, with an honest, intelligent and painstaking staff. 2nd. A good selection of honest, intelligent, well-instructed and painstaking enumerators, bound under the solemn obligation of an oath, to give a true and honest return. 3rd. An honest, willing and painstaking people to answer the questions put to them.

It is to be hoped that the first two conditions have been complied with, and that the people will each and all do their part in the interest of the country to make the work a success.

OTTAWA VALLEY NEWS.

(From Local Correspondents.)

St. Andrews.

Our people seem to be in the endeavor to obtain a Branch Railway from Lachute, to some point between St. Andrews and Carleton, which will afford reason for accommodation to both villages, and give ready means of transit to Montreal, for the products of the surrounding country. On last Friday evening, several gentlemen met and talked the subject over. It was unanimously agreed that the time had arrived when a united effort should be made to accomplish the project. Mr. Bell, C. E., was present and pointed out from a map of the previous surveys the various eligible routes between Lachute, St. Andrews and Carleton. It was stated that a road between these places could be built on very easy grades, and at a low price, and that there was sufficient business to give ample returns for the outlay. Mr. Bell was authorized to make a preliminary survey and to report to a subsequent meeting. On Saturday the farmers on both sides of the North River were consulted as to the donation of the right of way for the Road. They all appeared favorably inclined, and at a meeting held in the school-house in Carleton, on the Lachute Road, on Tuesday evening, a resolution was passed to allow the engineers to run a preliminary line across their farms where necessary. The question of the right of way was not much discussed, as it was thought best to leave that matter for further consideration, when the preliminary line shall indicate the route, and when other steps are taken, calculated to give more further assurance that the road will be built.

The members of the Argenteuil Fish and Game Club were gratified to learn from J. B. Mongenais, M. P., that the Dominion Government had decided to prohibit the use of seines in the Ottawa River within the Fishery District, of which Messrs. Jones and Lamoureux, are Fishery Officers, for the term of two years. Though it would have been more gratifying to have had the prohibition of longer extent, still the period of two years will be of great service, and no doubt largely increase the quantity of fish. Besides this action on the part of the Government is in the nature of an experiment, to see what the result will be on the size and quantity of fish, when seines are no longer used. Should their abolition prove beneficial, the Government will be inclined to extend the term. The thanks of every person interested in the preservation of fish, are due to

Messrs. Abbott and Mongenais, also to other friends who have aided in this matter. Now let the fishery officers in the prohibited District, faithfully perform their duties, in strictly enforcing the Fishery laws, and we shall very soon see the wisdom of the Government in suspending the issuing of licenses for seines, even for two years.

The weather in this locality has been demonstrating the correctness of Prof. Vennor's prediction. The storm came promptly, on Sunday, followed by a miserable condition of the atmosphere. The roads are almost impassable, while the ice in the North and Ottawa rivers is getting very rotten and dangerous to drive upon. I am informed that actions have been taken against several parties on the Lachute Road and other localities, to recover penalties for bad roads, and that three suits have been brought against the Parish of St. Jerome. I presume these prosecutions are instigated by the same party who for the past two or three years have annoyed the people with these vexatious litigations. For some time past, owing to the condition of the weather, acting upon the large quantity of snow on the road-beds, it has been almost and impossible to keep the roads in good repair, though, as a general thing, they have been in good condition during the entire winter; therefore it seems unreasonable that any Court will insist upon a strict enforcement of the provisions of the law, and mulct the defendants in costs and damages. The Municipal Code should be amended so as to require a notice of at least twenty-four hours on the parties in default in maintaining their portion of the highway, before an action for damages could be brought; and in the case of Municipalities, a notice of three days should be necessary, before the commencement of an action. A bond for costs and damages, with sufficient securities, should be required to be filed by a non-resident, or a person of no known pecuniary responsibility, before the commencement of a suit for penalties, in road cases. The different Parishes in this County should at once move in the matter, and make such representations to the Provincial Government as will cause these amendments to be made to the Municipal Code, at the next meeting of Parliament.

Walton on "The good and bad things characteristic of Arundel," was very instructive and well received.
