The Band of the 11th Battalion, after spending the afternoon at the picnic on Tuesday last in Cushing, delighted the people of Lachute by playing several fine selections upon our streets before this.

We were sure the inhabitants of Lachute would be very happy to see the Band, but we cannot expect the Band to do so unless we help them in the expense they incur in securing the services of our excellent Band Master as they have at present. A serious yachting disaster took place off Sandy Hook on Friday night, to the yacht "Blossie" of Philadelphia. A terrible squall struck the boat, capsizing it. The captain seeing the storm approaching had ordered the ladies, six in number, below into the cabin. These were all drowned and their bodies subsequently recovered from the wreck. The captain, two cabin boys, and two excursionists were saved. When the squall struck the vessel she was forced completely over on her beam ends, throwing those on deck into the water. The schooner fled very rapidly but was kept short by her sails and the air imprisoned in her cabin, the latter being suffocated or drowned. The passengers and crew in the water reached the boat and clung desperately to the planks. A pilot in a skiff came out and took them off.

The hall storm of Thursday, 29th, says the Ottawa Evening Journal, in which about 100 persons were killed, and the character of the storm, several families taking refuge in their cellars. For a few miles to the south of Montreal the windows in the north side of the dwelling houses were completely destroyed, several houses, and thousands of lives were killed. The pen crop in some places is said to be lost not only from the effects of the storm, but other crops also were badly damaged. In fact, the storm, the hall storm is said to have been very destructive also.
